Commissioner Mitchell motioned to amend the Agenda by removing Colonel Burkes presentation, as it is rescheduled for November 20th, and adding a presentation by the leadership from Coastal Women's Shelter. Her motion was seconded by Commissioner Smith and approved unanimously.

WHEREAS Craven County is recognizing August as Child Support Awareness Month, and reaffirms its commitment to strengthening Craven County’s families by providing child support services to improve the economic stability and well-being of children; and

WHEREAS, in State Fiscal Year 2022-23, more than \$7.7 million in child support was collected from parents of Craven County’s children, and

WHEREAS, there are nearly 4,430 child support orders in place, working to ensure that more than 4,488 children receive financial support from their parents: and

WHEREAS, the court must order either parent to obtain and maintain medical health insurance coverage for a child if it is actually and currently available to the parent at a reasonable cost.

WHEREAS Child Support Awareness Month salutes the diligent working parents who spend time with their child and who make regular child support payments, to safeguard their children's future: and

WHEREAS, strengthening individuals and families promotes the safety and well-being of children, provides stability, improves the lives of children, and provides opportunities for families to be able to enhance their children’s futures; and

WHEREAS, children who do not receive adequate financial and emotional support from their parents may experience greater difficulty in becoming healthy, happy, and productive citizens; and

WHEREAS, many concerned and dedicated judges, district attorneys, clerks of court, sheriffs’ personnel, and child support professionals work to establish and enforce child support orders for Craven County children, one of our county’s most vital resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the Craven County Board of Commissioners, do hereby proclaim August 2023 as “CHILD SUPPORT AWARENESS MONTH” in Craven County, and commend its observance to all citizens.

Justification: Bobby Evans and family made a donation of \$10,000.00 towards a shade structure at the new Pickleball Courts at Creekside Park. The donation was made in honor of his late wife, Kathy.

OFFICE OF SENATOR TED BUDD PRESENTATION

Mr. Sam Shumate, Southeast Regional Director for Senator Tedd Budd’s office, provided updates on recent House and Senate activities. He highlighted the \$109.5 million of funds secured for Cherry Point thus far. Mr. Shumate remarked that Senator Budd’s mother was a Craven County native, so it holds a special place in his heart. He provided his contact information and encouraged the Board to reach out to him at any time regarding Federal issues.

COASTAL WOMEN’S SHELTER PRESENTATION

Commissioner Mitchell introduced Chaplain Joe Daub, the current Chair of Coastal Women’s Shelter Board of Directors, and Executive Director, Amanda Delgado. She highlighted Promise Place was the only local organization serving victims of sexual abuse, and they abruptly shut their doors recently, leaving a gap. Mrs. Mitchell stated Coastal Women’s Shelter stepped up and expanded their mission to address the issue.

Ms. Delgado thanked the Board for their support and explained the various services Coastal Women's Shelter has provided to victims of domestic violence for over 35 years, inclusive of: court advocacy, crisis counseling, crisis line 24/7, community awareness, transportation assistance, and emergency shelter. Chaplain Joe Daub highlighted domestic violence statistics relevant to Craven County and emphasized the need to get the word out and secure volunteers. He referenced their current search for a new residential home. Ms. Delgado stated they would like to engage with local churches and organizations to explain how they can get connected.

Commissioner Mitchell indicated Promise Place had received funding from the State to aid sexual assault victims, but since closing so abruptly, it is unknown what has happened to those funds.

Commissioner Mitchell motioned to have staff draft a letter to the General Assembly from the Board of Commissioners requesting financial support for the Coastal Women's Shelter since they now are providing assistance to sexual assault victims. Her motion was seconded by Commissioner Hunt and approved unanimously.

Coastal Women's Shelter was presented with a check for \$526.00 recently raised from a Craven County employees' jeans day.

BOARD OF ELECTIONS PRESENTATION

Board of Elections Director, Susan Williams, provided background information on how she came to be involved in elections. She reported they are currently doing the mid-year campaign finance reports and she is keeping her eyes on law changes which have been implemented, which she highlighted. She remarked that upon her hire, she conducted an audit of the 2022 election and indicated staff had carried it off perfectly.

Commissioner Mark joined the meeting 8:55 am.

DEPARTMENTAL MATTERS: AIRPORT FAA GRANT FUNDING APPROVAL

Coastal Carolina Regional Airport Director, Andy Shorter, relayed that a Craven County signature is required to accept FAA Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Airport Terminal Program (ATP) grant for the commercial terminal expansion project.

He stated the Coastal Carolina Regional Airport Authority is in receipt of the FY23 BIL, ATP grant offer in the amount of \$5,000,000.00. He indicated this grant was awarded as part of a competitive award process for FY23 applications. Only three airports in NC were selected (EWN, CLT and AVL).

Mr. Shorter disclosed that this grant will be issued for the construction of the eligible share of the terminal hold room and the passenger boarding bridges for gates one and three. These areas provide the greatest impact to influence capacity issues and passenger access. He communicated that additional funding for this project will continue to be covered by annual FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants, NC Airport Improvement Program (NCAIP) state grant funding, and a modest contribution from the airport's operating fund. Total project cost is \$26,144,266.00.

Commissioner Mitchell motioned to accept and sign the FAA grant agreement, as requested, seconded by Commissioner Hunt and approved 7-0 in a roll call vote.

DEPARTMENTAL MATTERS: TAX

Tax Collection Settlement 2022

Tax Administrator, Leslie Young, updated the Board of the 2023 Revaluation, stating tax notices will be mailed on Thursday, July 20th and the Board of Equalization and Review are slated to hear appeals the following week.

Ms. Young reported that before being charged with the collection of the 2023 tax levy, the Craven County Tax Collector must present to the Board of County Commissioners her settlement of the 2022 tax levy. Pursuant to NCGS 105-373(3), Ms. Young requested that the settlement, along with the Board’s action regarding it, be entered into the minutes.

Ms. Young highlighted three noteworthy items:

- Net Levy amount of \$53 million has increased
- Total Releases, Refunds, and Write-offs are \$56,000 less; and
- Uncollected amount of taxes has decreased by \$90,000

Ms. Young recognized Cindy Glover, the Tax Collector Division Manager, for her hard work and efficiency.

Commissioner Bucher motioned to accept the following settlement of the 2022 Tax Levy, seconded by Commissioner Smith and approved 7-0 in a roll call vote.

2023 Charge to the Craven County Tax Collector

Ms. Young stated that once the Tax Collection Settlement 2022 is accepted, the Board must adopt and enter into its minutes an order to charge the Tax Collector with the collection of the 2023 tax levy. The order to be adopted is required by NCGS 105-321(b).

Commissioner Hunt motioned to charge the Craven County Tax Collector with the tax collection of the 2023 tax levy, seconded by Commissioner Howard and approved 7-0 in a roll call vote.

COUNTY MANAGER’S REPORT

County Manager, Jack Veit, reminded the Board of the ribbon cutting at 11:00 am at the new CARTS facility. He welcomed all to attend.

COMMISSIONERS’ REPORTS

Commissioner Smith reported her family has been involved in the military since World War I and announced her nephew became the first Colonel in their family last week.

Ms. Smith remarked on the recent Workforce Development awards banquet and the testimony given by “Smoke” Boyd about his path to success as a result of training and support he received through Workforce Development.

Ms. Smith also reported on a community meeting in Duffyfield as they are striving to improve the community, addressing drug issues and decaying homes.

Commissioner Hunt noted time spent at the animal shelter with Commissioner Mitchell and Sheriff Hughes walking dogs, petting cats, and learning about the opportunities there. Mrs. Hunt commended Sgt. Koonce, who heads up the electronic monitoring program, and remarked on the successful GED program ongoing in the prison.

Commissioner Mark commented on a recent precinct meeting held in Fairfield Harbour, with the discussion being focused on Craven County schools.

Commissioner Mitchell echoed Commissioner Hunt's sentiments about the animal shelter and expressed satisfaction with how many people participated. Mrs. Mitchell indicated Dr. Osler is making changes and influencing great things. She highlighted there will be an Open House at the animal shelter on August 5th.

Commissioner Howard expressed gratitude to Economic Development Director, Jeff Wood, and Jack Veit for a recent tour around the County and the opportunity to learn about all the economic development irons in the fire.

Commissioner Bucher remarked on the recent press conference held jointly by the City of New Bern Chief of Police and the Craven County Sheriff to discuss the murder of a one-year old child. He indicated they appealed to the public to speak up about crimes and referenced the availability of an anonymous hotline. Mr. Bucher also encouraged people to see the Sound of Freedom movie as it is very impactful.

Commissioner Jones thanked the Sheriff deputies in attendance and their service. He thanked all the Board members for their support and emphasized how well they work together on County issues.

At 9:41 am, Commissioner Hunt motioned to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Mitchell and approved unanimously.
